

About the Survey

- 5,601 Israelis interviewed face-to-face, at the respondent's residence
- Respondents selected through random sampling within neighborhoods (statistical areas all across the country)
- Interviews conducted in Hebrew, Russian, Arabic from October 2014 to May 2015
- Oversamples of Arab Christians, Druze, Haredim, Jews in West Bank, Arabs in East Jerusalem
- Follows the Central Bureau of Statistics' definition of the Israeli population, including Jews living in the West Bank as well as Arab residents of East Jerusalem

% of Israeli adults who identify as ...





% of Israeli Jews who say Jews around the world should have the right to make aliyah to Israel ...




Jewish state and democracy seen as compatible

Religious law vs. democratic principles


If there is a contradiction between halakha and democratic principles, which should be given preference?



Sharp disagreements among Jews on public policy issues


% of Jews who favor/oppose shutting down public transport in the entire country on Shabbat ...

% of Jews who favor/oppose allowing Conservative and Reform rabbis to conduct marriages in Israel ...





Most Arabs say Israel can<u>not</u> be both a democracy and a Jewish state


% in Israel who say Israel can be a democracy and a Jewish state at the same time ...




Support for religious law among Muslims/Christians

% of Muslims who favor making **sharia** official law of the land for Muslims in Israel ...


% of Christians who favor making **Bible** official law of the land for Christians in Israel ...






Among Arabs, declining belief in possibility of two-state solution


% who say a way can be found for Israel and an independent Palestinian state to coexist peacefully ...



Are leaders sincerely seeking peace?




Mutual doubts about sincerity of leaders in peace process

% who say Muslims face <u>a lot</u> of discrimination in Israel ...






% of Jews who strongly disagree/disagree and strongly agree/agree with the statement "Arabs should be expelled or transferred from Israel" ...


Friendship Circles

% in Israel who say ... of their close friends share their religion




Friendship circles among Jews





Trend 1: Muslims rising as a share of the Israeli population


% in Israel classified as ...

Trend 2: Due to high birth rates, Haredim rising as a share of adult population (20+)


% of Jews who identify as ...

Trend 3: Some decline in share of Jews with moderate levels of religious observance


% of Jews who say they follow ... of the Jewish tradition





% in Israel who say religion is very important in their lives among...




% in Israel who say they attend religious services at least once a week among...

% in Israel who say they have a college degree among...




Importance of family goes across religious lines

% in Israel who say maintaining strong family relationships is very/somewhat important to them among...




Jews and Arabs agree on importance of personal career success

% in Israel who say personal career success is very/somewhat important to them among...




Jews and Arabs agree on importance of helping the needy

% in Israel who say helping people who are in need is very/somewhat important to them personally among...




Importance of secular and religious education among Jews and Arabs
