


Arab Women in Israeli Society face 3 layers of discrimination:


ARAB WOMEN IN PUBLIC LIFE | BATTLING EXCLUSION



Since 1948, only 73 Arab Women have been elected to local councils



In the 2013 elections, 50 local Arab councils had no women candidates at all.



There has only ever been one Arab Woman who has led a local authority, and this was only for 6 months in a rotation agreement.



BACKDROP | VIOLENCE AND INTIMIDATION

- High voter turn-out rate: Local elections in Arab towns are of key interest, but often towns divided by different family/clan loyalties;
- Violent atmosphere: intimidation of candidates; street violence; use of illegal weapons
- Shaming of women candidates: Women take a risk when standing for office
- Social Media: Increasing violent rhetoric
